Eileen Reynolds 1941 - 2024



It is with great sadness that we have to report the loss of our Editor, Eileen Reynolds. Having been in failing health for some time

with an aggressive form of leukaemia, Eileen was admitted to Kirkcaldy's Victoria Hospital, where she died peacefully on Monday 09 September with daughter Kathryn and son Andrew at her bedside. Described by one of her friends as 'a beautiful soul' who will be much missed by so many people, Eileen, was a Fifer, born in Kirkcaldy in 1941. A pupil at Buckhaven High School, Eileen was gifted academically, excelling in languages, and on leaving school she graduated with a degree in French and German from the University of Edinburgh. Eileen's love of German in particular never failed, she was fluent in reading, writing and speaking the language. Gaining a further degree in 1986 – a Master of Letters in Contemporary German Studies from the University of Strathclyde – Eileen had a very impressive CV in project and event management, committee work and publications.

Eileen married Lawrence Reynolds in Dysart's St Serf's Church in August 1969 and they were blessed with a daughter Kathryn, son Andrew, and then in turn their partners Alaster and Alex, and grandchildren Caitlin, Ben and Jake. Eileen was one of this world's workers, she loved to contribute, loved to be involved and loved to keep herself busy. Retiring to Largo in 2006, Eileen and

Lawrence quickly made new friendships – the Saturday morning breakfasts at the Aurrie and the Golden Girls lunches being but two examples - and they involved themselves in church and community life. For several years, Eileen was minute secretary of Largo's Kirk Session and Business Committee and she was also actively involved with this magazine, most recently as Editor, where her administrative and editing skills came to the fore. She attended many concerts and operas, was a member of Glasgow University's choral society, and sang in several church choirs including here in Largo.

She was much loved and respected and will be missed a great deal by her family, friends and all of us at Largo Links.



Scottish Country Dancing Group

We meet weekly at the Durham Hall on

Burns Country Dancing -

Thanks to the Burns Museum we know that Robert Burns enjoyed country dancing. Much to his father William's disapproval, Burns regularly left the Lochlea farm and walked to a thatched cottage in Tarbolton, leaving the worries of farming life to enjoy the fiddle music of his dance master William Gregg, and the company of local girls. While his father viewed dancing as sinful, Robert saw only pleasure and a means of "giving my manners a brush" and enjoying good company. Burns' appreciation of Scottish Country dancing is illustrated in Tam O'Shanter; Warlocks and witches in a dance: Nae cotillion, brent frae France, But hornpipes, jigs, strathspeys, and reels, Put life and mettle in their heels."

While our dancing does not have the dark undercurrents of the witches and warlocks of the poem, the steps and music Burns enjoyed are still vibrant today in the warm and welcoming companionship of our local Wednesday afternoon sessions at the Durham Hall. Gregg's fiddle can be seen in the Burns Museum in Alloway. Thanks to Kate Macleod for this article

Polish Weekend in Fife

As many of you know, Largo House was the home for the 1st (Polish) Independent Parachute Brigade, under the command of General Sosabowski. After the war, many of the soldiers settled in Scotland and their descendants live here today. In recent years, there have been commemorations of their part in the war, notably in *Market Garden*, the attempt to take over a bridge at Arnhem.

Videos of the 2024 commemorations, are on YouTube. Search for: **SOSABWEEKEND** There are three videos, each lasting about 3 minutes:

Day 1 - Mostly in Largo: scenes from the War Memorial, Largo Cemetery and the Simpson Institute.

Day 2 - Set at Kincraig Point and Elie.

Day 3 - Mostly in Polish, with subtitles.

Largo Celebrates Rabbie Burns

Largo folks have celebrated many a Burns Night over the years. In 1859 the Burns centenary was marked by a dinner in the schoolhouse attended by around 130 farmers, merchants and others. Ladies were admitted after dinner and treated to wine and cake, and the "hilarity kept up until a late hour". During the nineteenth century many towns and villages established a 'Burns Club'. Largo Burns Club was established in 1894. Frederick Roome Lumsden, schoolmaster at Newburn, was its first President. For these 'Largo Burnsites' the 25th January was truly a Red-Letter Day, when members would enjoy a celebratory dinner, raise loyal and patriotic toasts, recite verse, sing songs and read out greetings from other Burns Clubs. Burns Night was also a key date on the calendar of Largo Brass Band. A 'Grand Concert' labelled 'A Nicht with Burns' was the order of the day for the band in 1897. In 1901 the Crusoe Lodge of the Good Templars were due to observe Burns Night but, due to the death of Queen Victoria days before, agreed to devote their gathering to her memory. The memory of the national bard was marked each year throughout the 1920s and 1930s by the Largo and Lundin Links Men's Social Club. In 1924, for example, Mr R. C. Paxton of Homelands presided over a large company. The Dundee Courier told of how; "After tea, pies and haggis had been served, Mr Munro Adamson, Drumpark, gave an interesting paper on "Burns", illustrated by several

songs, which were greatly appreciated. The "haggis" was played in by Piper Redpath, Leven, and carried round the room by Mr D Wallace, who was dressed in the style of the Bard and Mr J Y Hunter, headmaster Cellardyke, recited the "Address to the Haggis" in fine style. A musical programme comprising Burns songs was also carried through." The Largo W.R.I. also regularly observed Burns Nicht. The 1927 event in the Simpson Institute was reported in the Courier: "The haggis, which was carried by Miss M Kidd, was piped in by Mr Pedan, Lahill. An interesting paper was given by Rev. William Neil, Newburn, and was greatly appreciated. The songs "My Heart is Sair" and "Sweet Afton" were rendered by Miss C Baxter, Upper Largo and "Comin' through the Rye" and "Ca' the Ewes" were sung by Mrs Somerville....."To a Mouse" was recited by Miss N Blyth, Buckthorns. Haggis brought by the members was sold to augment the Rural funds." Over the decades every public space in Largo from Montrave Hall to Simpson Institute and New Gilston Hall to Wood's Hospital witnessed a Burns Supper. Becoming less exclusive through the years, every section of the community became involved in the celebrations from Largo and Newburn Old Age Pensioner's Association to Largo Boy Scouts, and Largo St David's Woman's Guild to Largo Kirk Men's Association. Today - 265 years after his birth - the appeal of Burns endures.

"Tae a chocolate Mousse"



Impress your friends and family with this Robert Burns inspired dessert!

- Whip 200/300 ml whipping cream until stiff.
- In a separate bowl, add 2 level tablespoons of fine sugar to 2 egg yolks. Beat until fluffy.
- Break 150g (milk or dark) chocolate into pieces and melt in 3 tablespoons of water until it has a creamy consistency. Let it cool a little, then quickly stir the melted chocolate into the egg-sugar-foam.
- Add the whipped cream carefully (by hand, not machine) into the chocolate-egg-sugar mixture, until the mousse is fluffy.
- Pour into serving bowls, cover and cool in the fridge for at least 4 hours.

Roasted Cauliflower With Lemon and Paprika

At once simple, but the lemon juice and smoked paprika really show off the lovely flavours of the cauliflower.



INGREDIENTS 1 medium cauliflower 2 lemons 3 tblsp olive oil ½ tsp smoked paprika Coarse sea salt METHOD

- Preheat the oven to 220C, gas mark 8
- Cut the cauliflower into medium even-sized florets and wash, leaving some water adhering.
- Mix in a bowl with the oil, the juice from one lemon, paprika and a little salt and pepper.
- Place in a roasting tray with the remaining lemon, cut into 6 segments, and roast for about half an hour until the edges are just browning.
- Squeeze over the juice from the cooked lemons and serve with a scattering of sea salt.

successful and we would like to thank everyone who contributed. The Photograph shows members



'Nae man can tether time or tide' - living where we do, we can't be anything but aware of the passing of time with each ebb and flow of the tide; it is a constant pulse flowing through us all. We cannot turn back time, but we can respond to the increasing urgency of environmental impact. Right from the start, Friends of Largo Bay set out the dual mission of protecting and enhancing Largo Bay. This we do through an integrated approach to protecting Largo Bay's environment; beach cleans, biodiversity monitoring; art activities; education and overall community involvement. So how do we set out to achieve this? We are very lucky to have an increasing number of very dedicated volunteers. We need to use this resource wisely, so rather than duplicate effort, we simplify. Whilst we are cleaning the beach we conduct a litter survey. When we are planning sessions for the Science Saturdays we link the themes to other art and educational programmes we have underway. An example of this is the way we are engaging with concerns over water quality. In addition to on-going



discussions with Scottish Water and SEPA, we are able to provide scientific evidence of the effect of poor water quality. Positive engagement with Largo Bay will encourage all who

enjoy it to gain better understanding and appreciation. Fundamental to that is our core belief in inclusivity and access to all. Recently, we welcomed Largo Beach Wheelchairs to our group. Plans are well underway for a Changing Places Toilet, an accessible toilet and storage for beach wheelchairs in Temple Car Park. Specially designed beach wheelchairs will be available for hire to enable access for all to the beach and the shoreline. Rabbie Burns was undoubtedly an environmentalist of his time. In poetry and prose, he showed a strong connection to nature and bore testimony then, to the damage humans could inflict. The alarm still sounds and we are listening. If you too would like to get involved with tackling current environmental issues and increase your local knowledge of what we have here on the doorstep, Friends of Largo Bay may be just the organisation for you:

We celebrated the 10th anniversary of the opening of Homelands on 22 September 2014 with a party in the Paxton Centre.

We have been running a series of 'Give it a Go Thursdays' thanks to Fife Voluntary Action's Mental Health funding. A second series is now underway. Information can be found on social media or by calling the centre for details.

'Wellness Wednesdays' with complementary therapist, Alison Graham run fortnightly. You can learn about ways to improve your mental, spiritual, physical, and emotional wellbeing. Prebooking is essential.

Using the MOTOmed exercise bike, local legend, Kitty Walker, raised £2105 for the Paxton Centre doing a sponsored cycle on the specialist exercise bike. Well done, Kitty.


And finally, we were all shocked and saddened to hear of the sudden death of Lorna Ravenscroft, who was a regular

Burns Celebration



Working Together for Largo - Role of Structures In The Largo Area

Have you considered the role of local voices in shaping the future of The Largo Area? The org chart shows the various groups collaborating to enhance our community. We also acknowledge the contributions of businesses, community groups, charities, individuals and religious institutions in enriching our landscape. We want to clarify the common question: what is the difference between Largo Communities Together (LCT) and the Largo Area Community Council (LACC)? The UK Government, the Scottish Government, and Fife Council are the main governing bodies. These elected groups are accountable to the public through voting. **Locally we have LCT**, A Charity and



voluntary organisation formed by residents of the Largo Area. LCT is accountable to the community through open monthly meetings, where everyone can share ideas, raise concerns, and participate in decision-making. LCT Trustees are elected every three years by our 350 members. Anyone

who lives here full time can be a member for £1. LCT works with other charities, regional and national organisations, local groups and residents to deliver on community initiatives and respond to local needs and interests when appropriate. LACC represents residents as the "Voice of the Local Community," conveying their views to Fife Council and other authorities as appropriate. Open monthly meetings welcome anyone with questions or concerns. The Community Council and LCT often collaborate and communicate, recently working on the "Local Place Plan," which reflects residents' aspirations for housing, transport, paths, green spaces, and amenities in the Largo Area. Both organisations are committed to advocating for this plan.

LCT: A Year in Review

Largo Communities Together (LCT) has had a busy and productive year, making significant progress on initiatives stemming from the Community Action Plan. Our Local Place Plan is up on the website and is registered with Fife Council. LCT remains committed to working with other organisations and groups to benefit the community. Here's a closer look at some key areas: Community Wellbeing

Warm Welcome Initiative: To combat winter isolation, LCT has revived its "Warm Welcome" gatherings, offering a chance to connect with neighbours and learn about local projects while enjoying refreshments. These sessions are held at various locations:

- Simpson Institute (Upper Largo): Every Tuesday, 11am–1pm, soup, tea, and coffee are provided.
- Largo Library and community hub: Hot drinks and biscuits are available whenever the library is open, just ask one of the friendly volunteers.
- Durham Hall: "Souper Sunday" offers a delicious way to connect on the last Sunday of each month.

Youth Engagement

 An exciting youth film project is being explored, with a potential launch in January. Anyone interested in participating or learning more is encouraged to contact LCT.

Accessibility and Infrastructure

 The Assets and Access group is dedicated to improving paths, cycle routes, and accessibility to community assets. This involves ongoing research and community engagement to identify areas for improvement. The group is working towards developing an action plan and advocating for funding to implement these improvements.

Community Preparedness

 LCT has finalised a comprehensive Emergency Plan for the community. The next step is to ensure it is easily accessible to all residents - keep an eye out for that.

Heritage and Culture

- LCT has contributed to the "Welcome Levenmouth" trails, showcasing local heritage.
- A heritage and people's history group has been established and welcomes new members and ideas. The group has begun documenting local history using borrowed recording equipment, including a "Memories of Kirkton School" event.
 Plans include exploring Pictish sites in the area and holding exhibitions. Ideas for an Alexander Selkirk event in 2026 are also being considered.



Largo Pier Project

Largo Communities Together held a public meeting on Tuesday 29th November in The Durham Hall to provide an update on the status of the pier project.



The 'Beast From The East' badly damaged the pier in February 2018. In the immediate aftermath, a small group of individuals held a public meeting, and it was agreed the residents wanted to see Largo Pier restored if possible. That group subsequently joined LCT. Jimmy Simpson led the Pier group through six years of diligent planning work to investigate how that might be achieved. The Crusoe Hotel owns the pier, but they had signed a Memorandum of Understanding with LCT that it would be transferred to community ownership if the Pier Group could get it restored. Unfortunately, it is now clear that the cost of restoration is likely to be over £2 million, and whilst every effort has been made to get funding, raising this amount has simply not been possible. For this reason, the LCT Pier Group cannot go any further despite having all the work and support in place. Louise Robb, chair of the trustees, said: "A

huge amount of work has been done by the team of volunteers who are skilled, experienced people - architects, civil engineers, legal experts and pier engineers. We have had designs and drawings done and built up a bank of usable plans and reports". The drive to take ownership of the pier and carry out the work saw some £70,000 raised to enable detailed drawings and plans to be drawn up, but the £2m bill rested heavily on securing major funding. The trust has gone to every organisation including the National Lottery without success. Hopes of landing up to £700,000 from Leven Reconnected also faltered as its financial input came with the caveat the work had to be done by March 2026, which means the work would need to be completed over Summer 2025. This is not possible due to the length of time it would take to finalise designs and go through the tendering process. Brendan Diamond, cochair of the Pier Group and a trustee, said: "We have run out of road. This is a £2m project which we would have had to start by March 2025 at the latest - we are at the stage we just can't go any further with public funding all up in the air right now. "We have tried everything. We have been to Scottish Government Ministers and asked for a delay of the funding dates and were told no." Louise added: "The Pier Group have done the very best they could". The work done to date has been enormous and it is all sitting there waiting on funding. LCT will continue to liaise with The Crusoe to monitor any further development.



In order to finance a trip to Largo in Scotland, the middle school students of the Youth Municipal Council (CMJ) have formed a junior association called "Le CMJ en action".



With the primary objective of bringing the twinning with Largo Area to life, Sarah, Maeve, Vassily and their friends plan to organise their trip during the All Saints' Day holidays in 2025. The junior association will allow them to organize their actions in order to raise funds and find subsidies or sponsorship. When the twinning with Largo took shape, it quickly became clear that the Youth Municipal Council had to get involved, explains Arthur Rouyer, Municipal Councillor delegated to youth. With this system, the young people, on the advice of their referent Marc Fontaine set up the stay project themselves, establish the provisional budget and make the reservations. I'm here simply to structure and provide advice, then the members of the association vote. The project will only succeed if they are invested.

You can find the CMJ in action all year round at various municipal events with various sales or entertainment proposals. 
